COVID-19 Pandemic Update

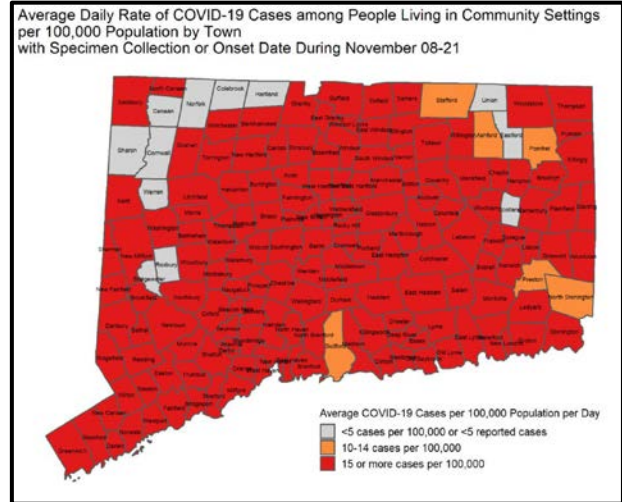

STATE

- The number of Connecticut towns in the red category has risen to 151.
- The number of patients currently hospitalized with COVID-19 has now surpassed 1,000 – roughly half the number observed during the peak this past spring.
- This week the Governor issued an Executive Order allowing the issuance of up to \$10,000 fines for certain commercial violations of the Sector Rules.

MONROE

- As of last night, DPH reports a total of 370 confirmed and 31 probable cases in Monroe.
- Our 2-Week Case Rate remained the same as last week – an average 7.5 new cases per day, which equals an average of 38.9 per 100,000 population.
- The Monroe Team continues to work closely with the State of Connecticut to provide additional testing sites in our area, and in planning for future vaccination distribution. We will share details as soon as they are available.
